

LESSON 3: THE SACRAMENTS / ANSWERS

SACRAMENTS: COMMUNION AND BAPTISM

1. **Baptism**

- A. Baptism shows us Christ has done for us to **SAVE** us from our sins.
- B. Baptism tells us that if we trust in Jesus that all our sins are **WASHED** away forever. (Romans 6:1-11, Colossians 2:11-15)
- C. Baptism tells us that the **HOLY SPIRIT** dwells in us, and baptism makes us **MEMBERS** of the **CHURCH**.
- D. Most Christians believe that the **CHILDREN** of Christians are to be baptized because they too belong to God's **FAMILY**.

2. **Holy Communion / The Lord's Supper / The Eucharist**

- A. We call this sacrament the **LORD'S SUPPER** because in it we have **DINNER** with Jesus.

- B. We call this sacrament the **COMMUNION** because it in our **UNION** with Jesus is deepened.
- C. We call this sacrament the **EUCHARIST** because we are **THANKFUL** for what Jesus has done for us.
- D. The bread represents the **BODY** of Christ, and the wine represents the **BLOOD** of Christ. We come to the Lord's Table because we need all of **JESUS** we can get!
- E. It's not that we believe that the bread and wine **CHANGE** into Christ's physical body and blood, but that Christ gives more and more of his life to those who come to the Table with **FAITH**.
